According to both parties, they meet at Victim's apartment.

June 23, 2015
Victim files a Policy of Equality (sic) claim against Mandoyan.

July 10, 2015
Mandoyan is relieved of duty.

July 14, 2015
El Segundo Police Department responds to Victim's home to take a police report of the incidents between Mandoyan and Victim.

July 14, 2015
Victim gets a restraining order.

July 22, 2015
Mandoyan is served with a restraining order.

August 12, 2016

The Department sends letter to Mandoyan stating its intention to discharge him.

Between August 15 and September 15, 2016

Mandoyan appears for a Skelly hearing with his former Chief.

September 15, 2016

After review, Department decides to continue forward with its decision to discharge Mandoyan.

September 26, 2016

Mandoyan appeals Department's decision.

Now Chief of Staff Lawrence Del Mese e-mails former Chief Alicia Ault

November 30, 2018

Chief Ault leaves the Department after e-mailing Chief Of Staff Del Mese that she has forwarded the Sheriff Elect's "priority request," to County Counsel so that Mandoyan can be brought back to work.

December 4, 2018

Sheriff Villanueva is sworn-in.

December 13, 2018

A memorandum is prepared and sent to Chief Steven Gross providing a "manageable chronology and summary analysis of key evidence" to be used by the ad hoc Truth and Reconciliation Panel.

December 21, 2018

"Truth and Reconciliation" Panel meet to review Mandoyan's case.

December 27, 2018

A disposition memorandum is prepared, memorializing the "Truth and Reconciliation" Panel's findings.

December 28, 2018

Mandoyan re-joins the Department.
